Sabbatical Gratitude

On Wednesday morning of August 28, I walked into the church office to return to my ministry for the first time in four months. I'm glad to say, like so much of the past four months, that Wednesday morning was exciting. As much as the sabbatical was a

break for me from my church duties, I was ready to resume ministry with the people of BCUC-readier than I expected I would be!

It has been quite the spring and summer for the Kim family. We traveled to some special places—South Korea, Singapore, Philadelphia, Niagara Falls, Mont Tremblant! I traveled too with my sisters to visit some places in Quebec and the Maritimes. We marveled at the stunning beauty of God's creation in all of the places we travelled to. We saw interesting attractions for the first time and met new and old friends. We immersed ourselves in the culture of the people, tasted the food of the locales and enjoyed the beauty and uniqueness of the places we visited!

Along with the travel, I also attended the Festival of Homiletics in Minneapolis, Minnesota in the second week of May. The Festival of Homiletics is a weeklong conference that brings together clergy and lay participants to listen and be inspired by a wide variety of outstanding preachers and professors of Homiletics (art of preaching). Theme for this year's festival is "Preaching as Moral Imagination". Through the festival, I was invited to consider various styles and techniques of preaching, delivery and preparation. Through the various themes and scriptural texts expounded by the preachers, my faith was renewed and my soul refreshed and I hope to share this renewed enthusiasm that I have experienced. Worship was never the same for me. Music was very much alive and present at the festival and yes, friends abound! Finally, I was also nudged to do something about my faith. Walking the talk was very much part of the call in all of the sermons that I've heard and reflected on. I brought home with me this passage written on a huge banner that was hanging on the wall of the Westminster Presbyterian Church in Minneapolis: "Justice is what love looks like in public."

Another highlight of my sabbatical time was what I called "church hopping". On those Sundays that I was not traveling, I visited a total of eight United Churches in Ottawa and noted the worship life and how church service is done, how the sermon was preached and what programs are being done in each congregation. The churches I visited include Riverside, Emmanuel, Rideau Park, Barrhaven, Kitchissippi, Parkdale, Stittsville and Knox. Visiting other churches gave me the opportunity to sit in the pew as a worship goer and to experience worship with other worshippers outside BCUC. It also gave me the opportunity to learn what ministries each church was doing that were different from BCUC.

While I was away, the life and ministry of BCUC were under the able hands of Lorrie Lowes, our ministry candidate. Thank you, Lorrie, for your leadership and your presence. Note of thanks goes also to Rev. Angela Bailey for helping with Pastoral Care and leading a service, and to Rev. Camille Lipsett, who with Angela assisted in the Board meetings during my absence.

Finally, the sabbatical time gave me space for self-rest and self-engagement in rich and full ways that prepared me to re-engage BCUC and my role as a minister with a new sense of health and wholeness. I viewed the sabbatical period as an opportunity to pull off into a "rest area" for a while as we continue the journey of ministry together--a journey that has now continued for six years. What a gift it was! But now it's time to resume the journey that we're on together as pastor and people. I'm back and ready to go!

For this gift of Sabbath, I am truly grateful. Happy thanksgiving!

Secret Pal Project

Your Family Ministry group is initiating a matching program in order to strengthen the bonds between generations in our congregation. We will match adult and child.

ADULTS: If you wish to be a special friend to a child, you can fill out the form and give it to Camille in person or by email and then you will have the opportunity to become acquainted through cards and letters with one of our Bell's Corners' children.

Your cards and notes will be signed 'Your Mystery Friend' and left in the Secret Pal Mail Box in the foyer of the church. You will be given a child's name and birthday. Your special pal will meet you in person, after seven months of mystery letters, at a luncheon party after church one Sunday next spring. You are asked not to send gifts but only letters and cards (Birthday, Christmas, Easter, Hallowe'en etc.).

I will give your name to an adult in the congregation who wants to be a Secret Pal. You will receive letters and cards until May when you will meet your mystery friend at a luncheon party after church. You may want to write notes back and put them in the special Secret Pal Mail Box in the foyer of the church. On the outside of the envelope just write, 'From: _______' and your name and we will make sure your pal receives your note or card or picture.

It will be exciting to solve the mystery of the secret pals at our Friendship Gathering when secret friends become known to each other and all have lunch together in the spring.

This is a brief summary of BCUC's financial status as of August 31, 2019.

Note that the Operating Fund is below expected revenue and needs immediate attention.
